How the naked body is evaluated – and whether a body is perceived to be naked – depends significantly on the historical, social, religious, and cultural – and political – context.

The exhibition "The Naked Body – A Matter of Perspective" is the first collaborative project between the Museum Kurhaus Kleve and the Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences. Students of the social science bachelor's programme Gender and Diversity developed the exhibition as young curators: works from the collection of the Museum Kurhaus Kleve are shown, thematically supplemented by loaned artworks as well as works created especially for the exhibition by students of Information and Communication Design. The spectrum of artworks on display includes sculptures, paintings, drawings, graphic art, photography, but also films and videos: from the 16th century to the present day.

In a dialogue between art and gender and diversity studies, the exhibition invites to reflect common perspectives on the naked body and to challenge them in relation to body norms and colonial imprints, to dare a change of perspective from the naked body as an object to a subject, to agency. This has resulted in a diverse and complex exhibition, which aims to prompt new ways of seeing the naked body. The hope is that this encounter with different, sometimes ambiguous and contradictory – and also provocative – artistic positions on the theme of nakedness will lead to an increased openness to a social reality that demonstrates the same plurality.
